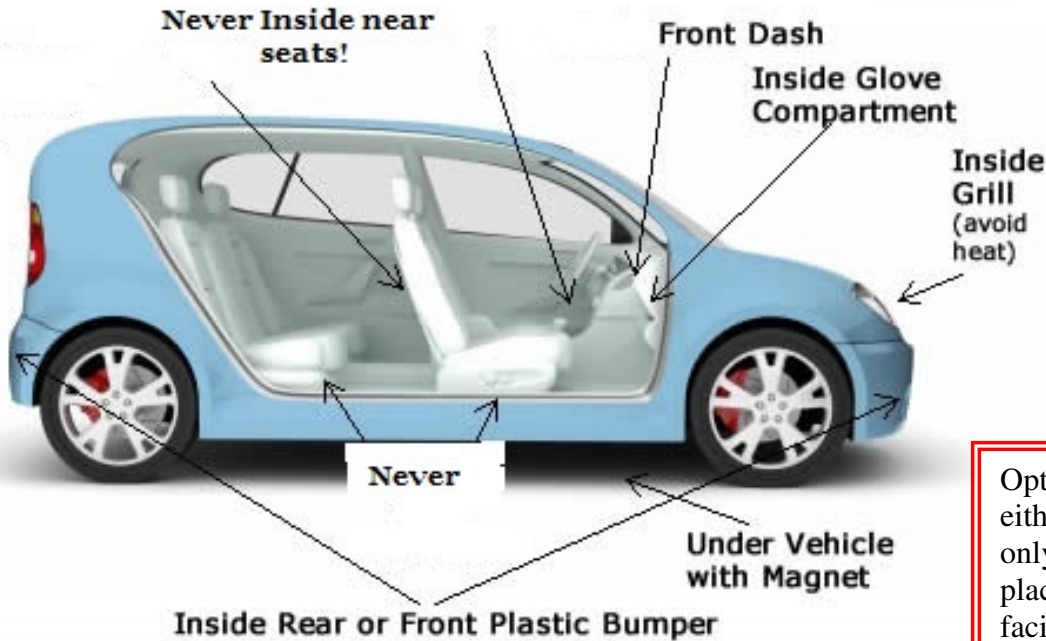


GPS PLACEMENT

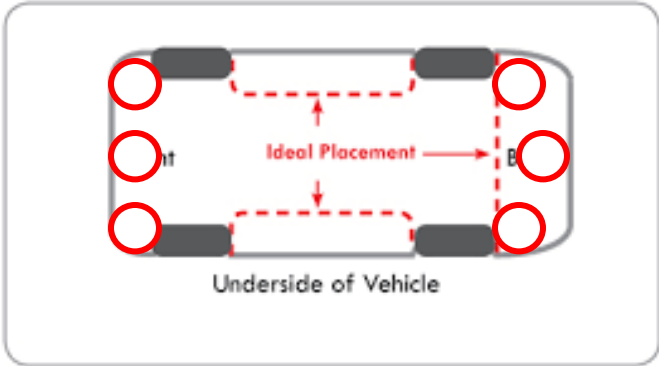
Covert GPS Placement



Placement is the most critical aspect of covert tracking! Never place a GPS tracker inside the vehicle if at all possible unless you are using a OBD plug in tracker. If you place a tracker inside a vehicle only place in the dash glove box or under the dash board of the vehicle.

Optimum placement is under a vehicle either facing up towards the sky and only shooting thru plastic! Second placement method is under the vehicle facing down but only on the back or front near the left, right, or middle of the vehicle.

DO NOT place a GPS tracker on a muffler, gas tank, or anywhere near excessive heat as explosion could occur.



○ Ideal Placement

Never place a GPS tracker more than 12 inches into the center of the vehicle, keeping the tracker near the outer edge is the best place for tracking as the tracker is receiving bounced GPS signals from the ground.

GPS Trackers receive only two types of signals. (1) Cellular signals and (2) GPS signals

(GPS SIGNALS) can only be received if the tracker is placed correctly! Cellular signals can be received and sent by the tracker no matter of placement (if not concealed in full metal). Investigators fail to understand that placement of your tracker determines battery life as well as accurate tracking. By following some simple rules of placement you can extend tracking life of the GPS unit and obtain more accurate tracks.
